Miconazole Nitrate 2% cream



Read this leaflet carefully before you start using this medicine. Keep this leaflet. You may need to read it again.

- If you have any further questions, ask your doctor or pharmacist.
- This medicine has been prescribed for you only. Do not pass it on to others. It may harm them, even if their signs of illness are the same as yours.
- If you get any side effects, talk to your doctor or pharmacist. This includes any possible side effects not listed in this leaflet.

What is in this leaflet

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1. WHAT MICONAZOLE NITRATE CREAM IS AND WHAT IT IS USED FOR

Miconazole nitrate cream contains a topical antifungal agent. "Topical" means that it is put on the skin. Miconazole nitrate cream is used to treat skin infections such as athlete's foot, jock itch, ringworm and other fungal skin infections like candidiasis.

This medication is also used to treat pityriasis (tinea versicolor), a fungal infection that causes a lightening or darkening of the skin of neck, chest, arms or legs.

2. BEFORE YOU USE MICONAZOLE NITRATE CREAM

Do not use Miconazole nitrate cream:

- if you are allergic (hypersensitive) to Miconazole nitrate or to other antifungals such as clotrimazole, econazole, ketoconazole or to any of the other ingredients of this cream (see section 6 for other ingredients).

Do not get the cream in your eyes. If you accidentally get some cream in your eyes, wash it out and contact your doctor immediately.

There are no known interactions with other medications.

Pregnancy and breast-feeding

- If you are pregnant or think you may be pregnant please tell your doctor or pharmacist before using this medication: this cream should be used only when clearly needed, discussing with your doctor the risks and benefits.

It is not known whether this drug passes into breast milk, so consult your doctor before breast-feeding.

3. HOW TO USE MICONAZOLE NITRATE CREAM

Apply Miconazole nitrate cream on the skin only. Clean and thoroughly dry the area to be treated and apply a thin layer of cream, rub in gently washing your hands before and after; this treatment should usually be made twice a day or as directed by your doctor.

Often it is advisable to keep using Miconazole nitrate cream for one week after all lesions have disappeared to prevent relapse.

This medicine may be harmful if swallowed.

If swallowing or overdose is suspected contact a poison control center or emergency room immediately.

Do not share this medication with others.

4. POSSIBLE SIDE EFFECTS

Like all medicines, Miconazole nitrate cream can cause side effects, although not everybody gets them.

Burning, stinging, swelling, irritation, redness, pimple-like bumps, tenderness or flaking of the treated skin may occur.

If any of these effects persist or worsen, notify your doctor or pharmacist promptly.

5. HOW TO STORE MICONAZOLE NITRATE CREAM

Do not use Miconazole nitrate cream after the expiry date, which is stated on the carton and the tube after EXP.

Do not store above 25 °.

Keep out of the reach and sight of children.

6. CONTENTS OF THE PACK AND OTHER INFORMATION

Carton containing 1 tube of 30g of Miconazole nitrate 2% cream with leaflet. Miconazole nitrate cream is a white cream.

Composition:

100 g of cream contain: Miconazole nitrate 2 g.

Excipients: cetostearyl alcohol, glycerol, liquid paraffin, cetareth 20, cetearyl alcohol, propylene glycol, methyl and propyl parahydroxybenzoate, purified water.
